

## **Alexandria Housing Activities September 2020**

**Upcoming Affordable Housing Development Proposals**. There are several rental and homeownership proposals that will come before City Council for pre-development loan approvals on Sept 8. They include: <u>\$500,000 to AHDC for a development in Arlandria;</u> <u>\$250,000 to AHDC for new development on Seminary Road</u> that combines affordable rental housing, affordable homeownership options, and a component of permanent support housing for Alexandrians with developmental disabilities; <u>\$400,000 for Wesley Housing for development of Parkview II at Holmes Run Parkway;</u> and a <u>\$2.5 million capital improvement loan to Landmark Towers LLC to preserve market affordability and secure a right of first refusal of a multi-family building</u>. These proposals are in the early stages of feasibility and will take several years to be developed, but together they represent a minimum of 860 new units of affordable housing, including a percentage of the total dedicated to households earning 40% of the area median income. As these proposals move through the development pipeline, broad community advocacy will be needed to secure the financial resources necessary to make them viable.

**CDC Eviction Moratorium Invokes Public Health Crisis** Attached are three documents to help you better understand the implications of the recent CDC Eviction Moratorium Order: <u>CDC</u> Eviction Moratorium Fact Sheet; FAQs on the Agency Order to the US Housing Committee on Financial Services; and the <u>CDC Declaration that Tenants must present to Landlords</u>. However, in the absence of clarity and general confusion as to whether the Administration has the authority to issue this order, Governor Northam has again requested that the Virginia Supreme Court extend their eviction moratorium until October 1, 2020. We will begin to use our <u>Northern</u> Virginia Eviction Prevention and Housing Stability Toolkit to assist in training volunteers to help residents with the process of securing rental assistance.
